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## Memory Leon

*Memory games are classic and a very nice way to play as well as learn playfully. Memory promotes concentration and visual memory. A homemade Memory game is even more special because the child can choose the images to be used. Memory Leon is perfect for using up fabric scraps. It consists of 12 pairs and also includes a box for storing the cards.*

The box and the cards for the pictures are sewn from cotton fabrics. For the pictures, you can also use jersey fabrics, as these can be reinforced with fusible interfacing.

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## sewing terms

**seam allowance** = When cutting pattern pieces, a seam allowance of approximately 3/8 in is often added. This ensures that the garment will not be tighter than it should be when sewn.

**trim seam allowance** = This refers to trimming the seam allowance after sewing. This makes the seams flatter.

**to clip** = For corners or curves, small notches are made in the seam allowance after sewing, so that the seam lies flat and the corner can be properly pushed out after turning.

**seam lock** = To prevent the seam from coming undone, a few stitches must be sewn forward and backward at the beginning and end of each seam.

**right fabric side** = The right side of the fabric is the more attractive side and should be used as the outer side.

**left fabric side** = The left side should be used as the inner fabric side. It is the less attractive side of the fabric.

**grainline** = This refers to the fabric grainline that must be observed when cutting pattern pieces.

**presser foot width** = The fabric is guided along the edge of the presser foot during sewing.

**apply** = Sew on appliqués using a zigzag stitch (stitch width 3.5 and stitch length 0.9). Use thread that matches each appliqué's color.

**edgestitch** = Here, sew close to the edge of the fabric.

**running stitch** = Here, sew over an edge to additionally stabilize it.

**curl** = The creation of gathers.

**right sides together** = Here, two pattern pieces are placed together with the right sides facing each other. The less attractive side is therefore on the outside.

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**finish** = Here, a zigzag stitch is used to sew over the fabric edges to prevent fraying and/or to sew them together at the same time.

**fold** = The pattern is placed once with the writing facing up on the fabric, and once mirrored along the fold edge on the fabric.

Please read the instructions carefully before you start sewing, as this will answer most questions in advance.

**A seam allowance of 3/8 in is already included in the pattern.**

Unless otherwise stated, always sew with a presser foot width.

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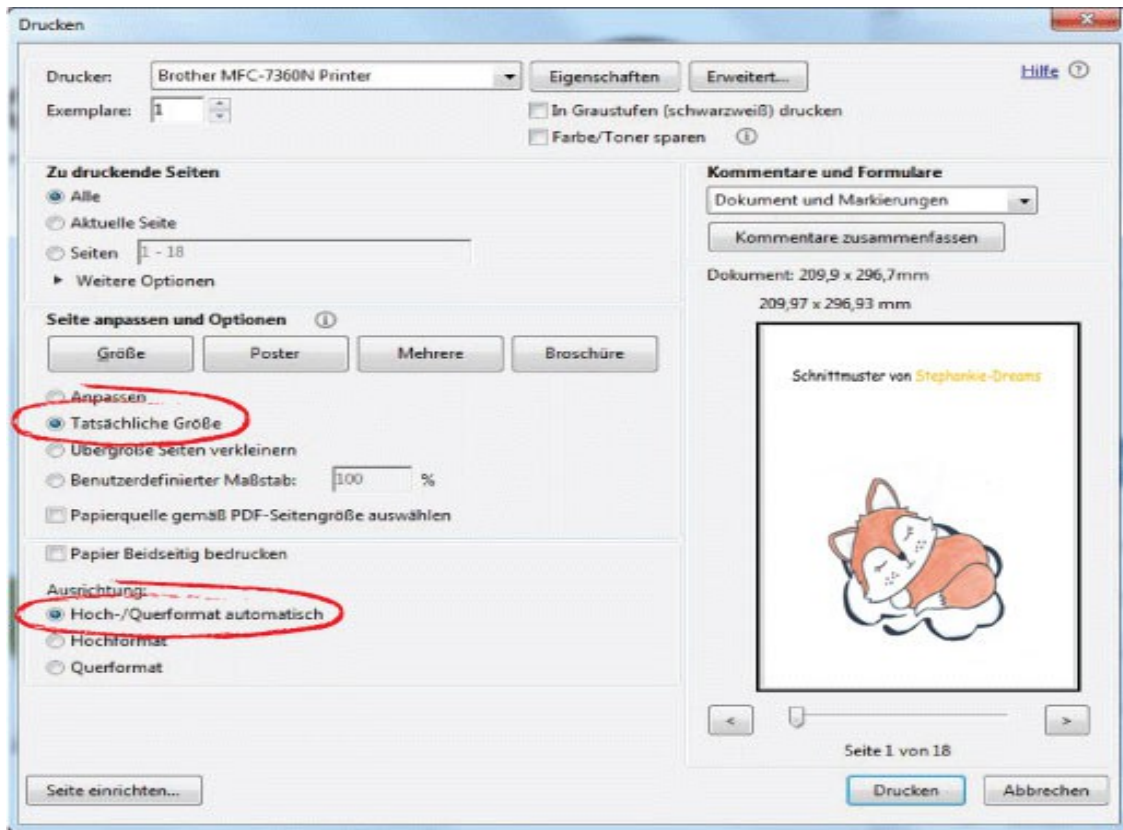
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## instructions for printing

### tip:

Print only the pattern in black and white to save costs and be environmentally friendly. The instructions are easy to read on screen.



The following print settings must be configured:

### Pages to print:

Select the Pages setting and enter the specific page numbers you need in the designated field.

### Size:

Choose Actual Size.



### Orientation:

Select Automatic Portrait/Landscape.

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	<p>Print all pattern pieces you need in their original size. Paper size must be 100%.</p>
	<p>For verification, there is a 2 in x 2 in check box on the pattern. Measure it carefully. First, print only the first page of the pattern and check if the measurements of the check box are correct. If the measurements are correct, you have printed your pattern correctly. Now, print the remaining pages you need with the same print settings.</p>

## required materials



- sewing machine
- needle universal
- iron
- scissors, pins or fabric clips, pen
- pattern
- thread in various colors, matching the selected fabrics

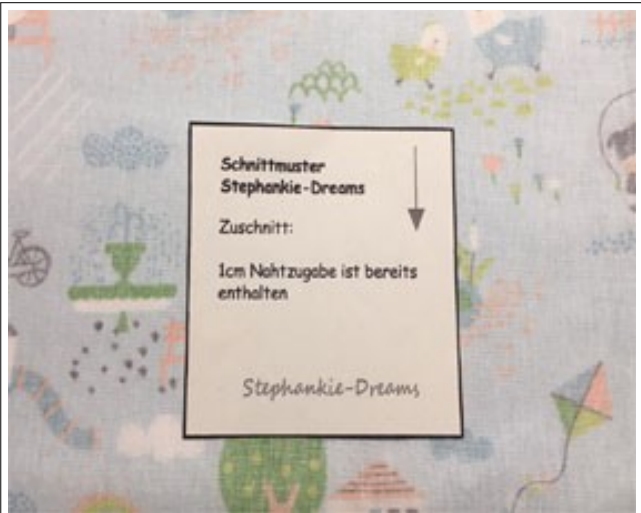
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## sewing instructions



First, cut out all required pattern pieces from fabric, fusible interfacing and decovil. Then, press all fabric pieces and iron fusible interfacing onto the pictures.



The pattern is placed with the writing facing up on the left side of the fabric.

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You now have the following pattern pieces :



for the memory do you have:  
24x map part from fabric for outside  
24x map part from fabric for inside  
for the box do you have:  
10x cover  
10x bottom



for the memory do you have:  
24 pictures 2 each from one, in total 12  
couples  
for the box do you have:  
1 picture



for the memory do you have from decovil  
24x card part reinforcement and from  
fusible interfacing 24x picture.  
for the box do you have from decovil 5x  
cover reinforcement and 5x bottom  
reinforcement and from fusible  
interfacing 1x picture.

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## make from the memory



First, the Memory game is made. For this, apply the Decovil interfacing to the wrong side of the back fabric pieces, leaving a 3/8 in seam allowance on all sides.



Place the front card piece on top of the back card piece, right sides together, and sew both pieces together along the marked line.



Cut a slit into the front card piece so you can turn the card piece inside out. Make sure the slit is not larger than the picture that will be sewn on top later.



Turn the card piece inside out.

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Close the opening by hand with a thread.



Now appliqué the picture you previously reinforced with fusible interfacing to the center of the front side of the card piece.



Sew the remaining 23 card pieces in the same way. The Memory game is now finished.

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## make from the box



The next step is to sew a box for storing the Memory game. First, the bottom of the box is made.



For this, apply the Decovil interfacing to the wrong side of five bottom pieces, leaving a  $\frac{3}{8}$  in seam allowance on all sides.



Place two bottom pieces right sides together and sew along the marked line. Note that you should not sew all the way to the bottom, leaving  $\frac{3}{8}$  in free. This is important so that you can properly sew in the bottom piece later.



You now have two connected pieces.

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Place the third bottom piece right sides together with the second bottom piece and sew both pieces together along the marked line.



You now have three connected pieces.



Place the fourth bottom piece right sides together with the third bottom piece and sew both pieces together along the marked line.



You now have four connected pieces.



Now place the end of the most recently sewn piece right sides together and edge to edge with the first piece, and sew it together along the marked line.



The outer cover is almost finished; the bottom just needs to be sewn on.



Place the fifth bottom piece onto the cover. You will see both fabrics from the wrong side. Sew the bottom piece along the marked line. Note that you should not start sewing at the upper edge, but  $\frac{3}{8}$  in lower, and do not sew all the way to the bottom, leaving  $\frac{3}{8}$  in free there as well.



The outer part for the bottom of the box is complete.





Sew the inner cover from the remaining bottom pieces in the same way. However, make sure to leave an opening for turning when sewing the first two pieces together.



Pull the inner cover over the outer cover, with both fabrics right sides together. Sew both pieces together around the upper edge.



Turn the pieces inside out through the opening you left for turning.



Close the opening with a close-to-the-edge zigzag stitch.



Insert the inner cover into the outer cover and topstitch the upper edge close to the edge.



The bottom of the box is finished; you can already place the Memory game inside.



Sew the pieces for the lid together in the same way as the pieces for the bottom. However, make sure to appliqué a picture onto the top piece of the lid first.



If you have made it this far, you can be proud: Your Memory game and its matching box are finished.
