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Egg Caps Karlie

At Easter, it is customary to dye and decorate eggs. It's fun and looks pretty. With the Karlie egg caps, you can create something truly special from Easter eggs. Seven different versions of a small cap turn the egg into a bunny, a chick, or a boy with a cool hat, or a girl with braids and a headscarf. These Easter eggs are a unique twist for the Easter nest or the Easter tree. The caps are designed to fit eggs of size M.

All the caps are sewn from jersey fabric. This is perfect for using up fabric scraps.

Sewn pieces made from this pattern may be sold without any quantity restrictions.

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sewing terms

seam allowance = When cutting pattern pieces, a seam allowance of approximately 3/8 in is often added. This ensures that the garment will not be tighter than it should be when sewn.

trim seam allowance = This refers to trimming the seam allowance after sewing. This makes the seams flatter.

to clip = For corners or curves, small notches are made in the seam allowance after sewing, so that the seam lies flat and the corner can be properly pushed out after turning.

seam lock = To prevent the seam from coming undone, a few stitches must be sewn forward and backward at the beginning and end of each seam.

right fabric side = The right side of the fabric is the more attractive side and should be used as the outer side.

left fabric side = The left side should be used as the inner fabric side. It is the less attractive side of the fabric.

grainline = This refers to the fabric grainline that must be observed when cutting pattern pieces.

presser foot width = The fabric is guided along the edge of the presser foot during sewing.

apply = Sew on appliqués using a zigzag stitch (stitch width 3.5 and stitch length 0.9). Use thread that matches each appliqué's color.

edgestitch = Here, sew close to the edge of the fabric.

running stitch = Here, sew over an edge to additionally stabilize it.

curl = The creation of gathers.

right sides together = Here, two pattern pieces are placed together with the right sides facing each other. The less attractive side is therefore on the outside.

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finish = Here, a zigzag stitch is used to sew over the fabric edges to prevent fraying and/or to sew them together at the same time.

fold = The pattern is placed once with the writing facing up on the fabric, and once mirrored along the fold edge on the fabric.

Please read the instructions carefully before you start sewing, as this will answer most questions in advance.

A seam allowance of 3/8 in is already included in the pattern.

Unless otherwise stated, always sew with a presser foot width.

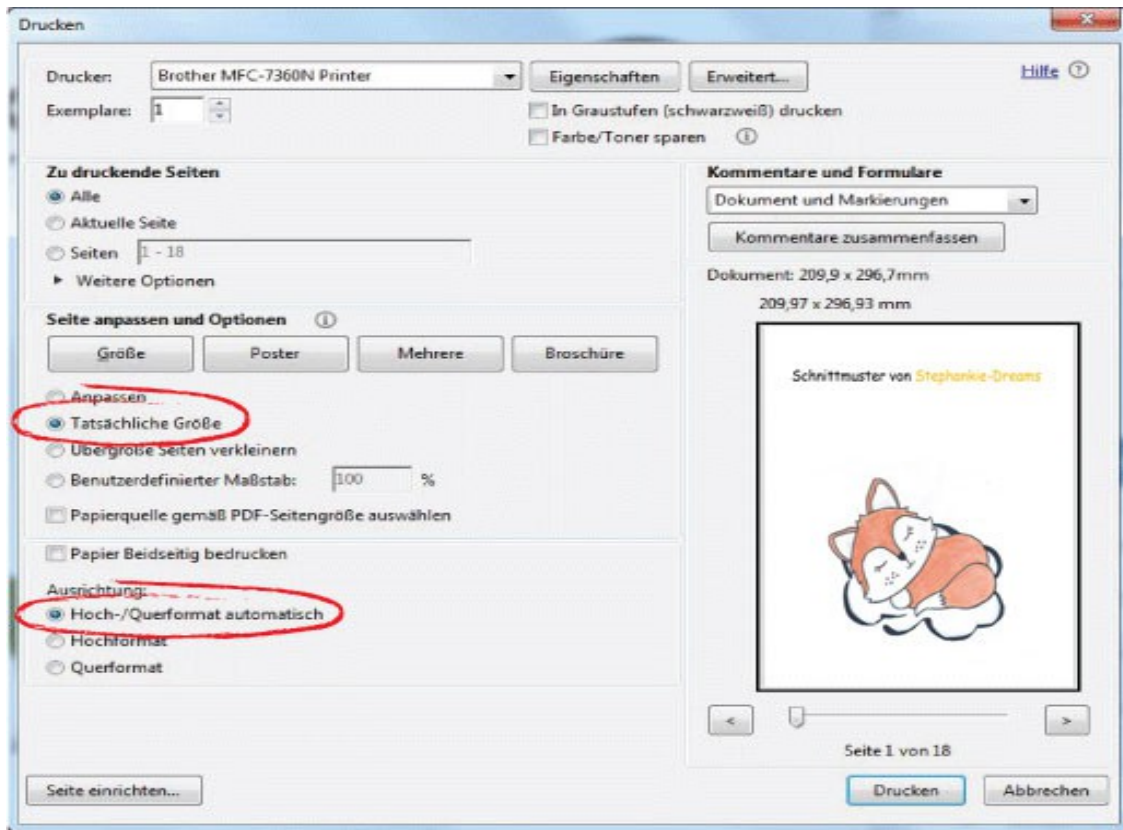

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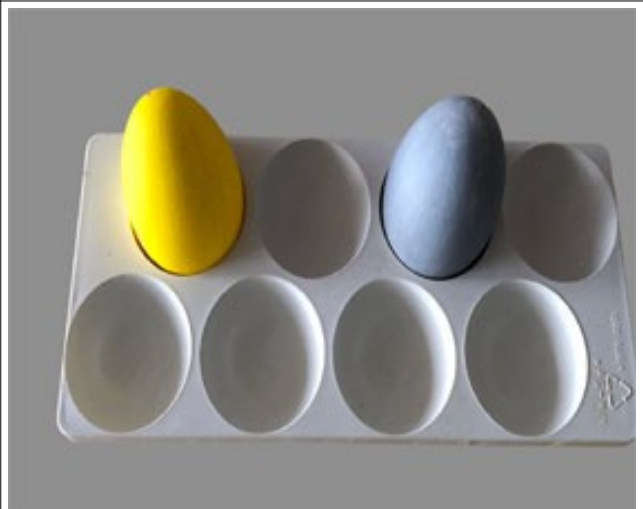
For the Easter nest, I dyed the boiled eggs with pastel colors.



These include pink, which I used as the face color, and yellow, which is for the chick.



For the Easter tree, I painted the blown-out eggs with acrylic paint.



Here, you can choose any color you want that matches the beanie.

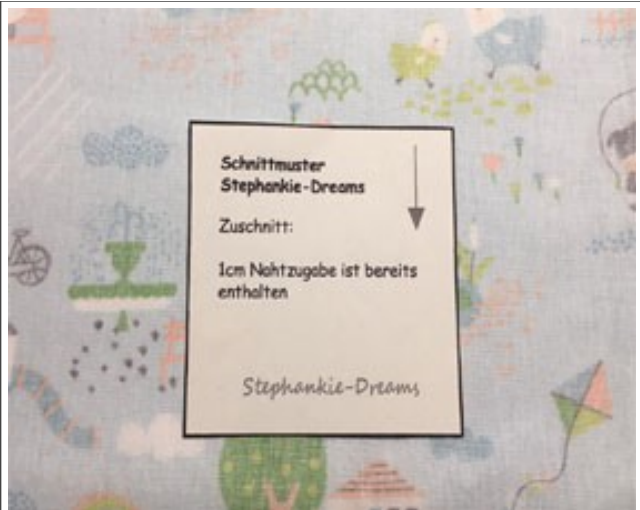
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sewing instructions simple beanie



First, cut out all required pattern pieces from fabric, batting, and fusible interfacing. Then, press all fabric pieces.




The pattern is placed with the writing facing up on the left side of the fabric. Counterposition means that the text is on the fabric side. Here as well, it is placed on the left fabric side.

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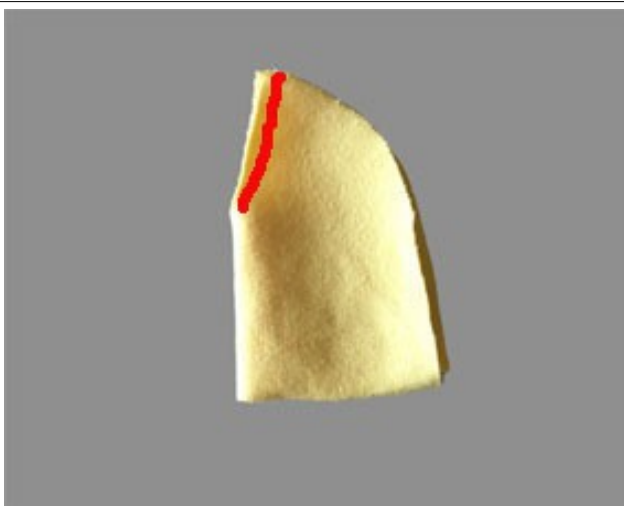
You now have the following pattern pieces:

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make from the simple beanie



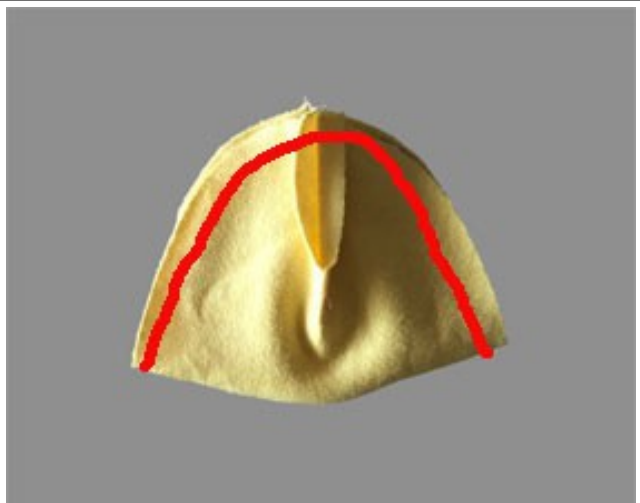
Place the beanie pattern piece in the middle, right sides together. Sew the top open edge along the marking.



The top edge is now closed.



Sew the second beanie pattern piece together in the same way.



Place both beanie pattern pieces right sides together, then sew them along the marking.

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Trim the seam allowance, then turn the beanie inside out.



Place the waistband in the middle, right sides together, then sew it along the marking.



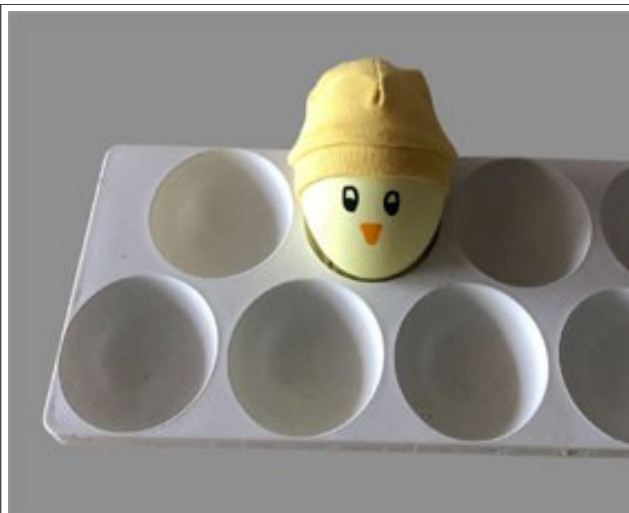
Turn the waistband inside out. Then fold it in half and align the edges together. The fabric should be placed with the wrong sides facing each other.



Pull the waistband over the beanie as shown in the picture, with the right sides of the fabrics facing each other. Make sure the seam of the waistband is positioned at the center of the back of the beanie. Sew both pieces together all around along the marking. Then trim the seam allowance.



The simple beanie is finished.



In yellow, it can be used for a chick.



In white, it can also be used for a chick. Here, the white beanie serves as the eggshell.

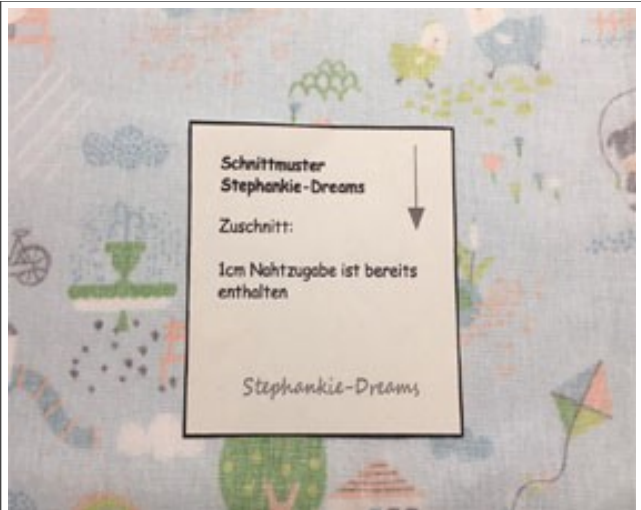


But it also looks great as a hat for a boy or a girl.

sewing instructions basecap



First, cut out all required pattern pieces from fabric, batting, and fusible interfacing. Then, press all fabric pieces and iron fusible interfacing onto the respective pieces.



The pattern is placed with the writing facing up on the left side of the fabric. Mirror image means the writing is on the fabric side. Here too, it is placed on the left side of the fabric.

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You now have the following pattern pieces:



beanie 2x, 1x of which opposite
waistband 1x
visor 2x fabric, 1x of which opposite, 1x
fusible interfacing

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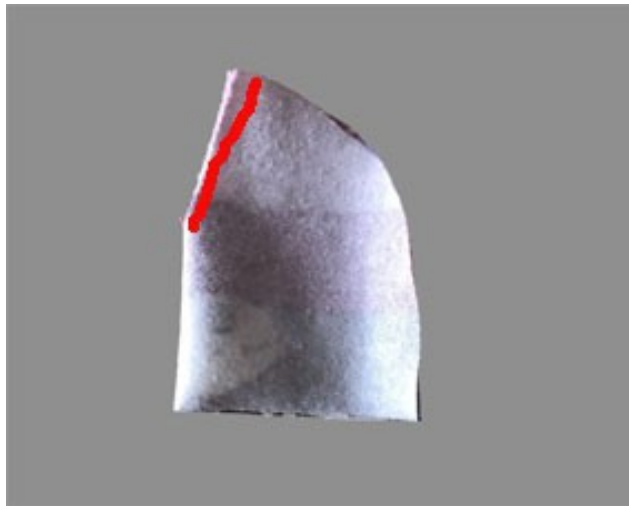
make from the basecap



Place both brim pattern pieces right sides together, then sew them along the marking.



Trim the seam allowance. Then turn the beanie inside out.



Place the beanie pattern piece in the middle, right sides together. Sew the top open edge along the marking.



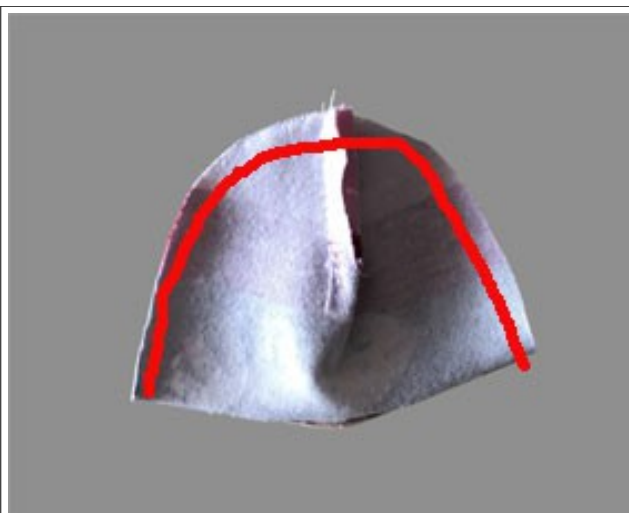
The top edge is now closed.

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Sew the second beanie pattern piece together in the same way.






Place both beanie pattern pieces right sides together, then sew them along the marking.



Trim the seam allowance, then turn the beanie inside out.



Place the brim as shown in the picture, centered on the front part of the beanie. Sew the brim in place with a narrow seam.

	<p>Place the waistband in the middle, right sides together, then sew it along the marking.</p>
	<p>Turn the waistband inside out. Then fold it in half and align the edges together. The fabric should be placed with the wrong sides facing each other.</p>
	<p>Pull the waistband over the beanie as shown in the picture, with the right sides of the fabrics facing each other. Make sure the seam of the waistband is positioned at the center of the back of the beanie. Sew both pieces together all around along the marking. Then trim the seam allowance.</p>

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The basecap is finished.

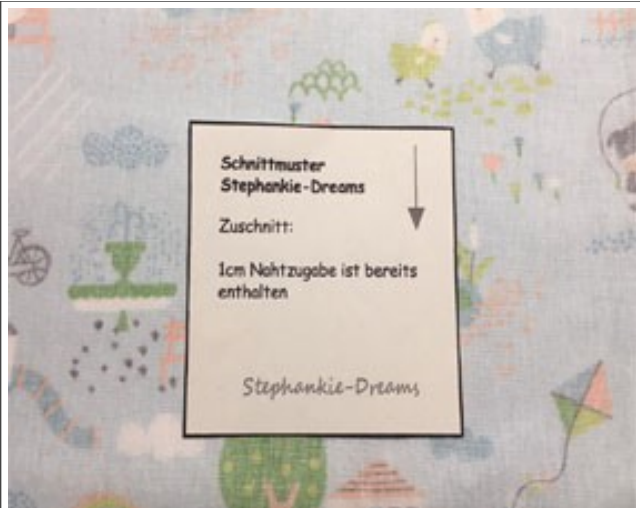


The basecap is great for a boy's face.

sewing instructions headscarf with braids



First, cut out all required pattern pieces from fabric, batting, and fusible interfacing. Then, press all fabric pieces.



The pattern is placed with the writing facing up on the left side of the fabric. Mirror image means the writing is on the fabric side. Here too, it is placed on the left side of the fabric.

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You now have the following pattern pieces:

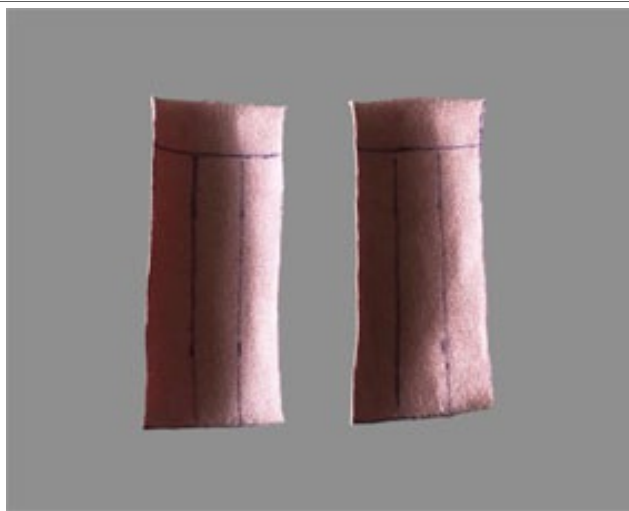


beanie 2x, 1x of which opposite
waistband 1x
headscarf 1x
hairs 2x

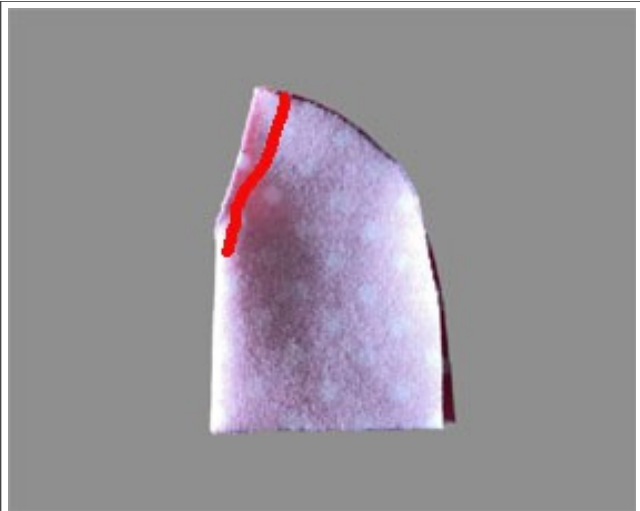
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make from the headscarf with braids



First, draw the individual hair strands on the left fabric side of the hair. To do this, measure 0,39 in from the top edge and make a marking. This is the seam allowance, where the hair will be sewn to the beanie. Then, make a marking at 0,39 in intervals along the width. These are the individual hair strands.



Place the beanie pattern piece in the middle, right sides together. Sew the top open edge along the marking.



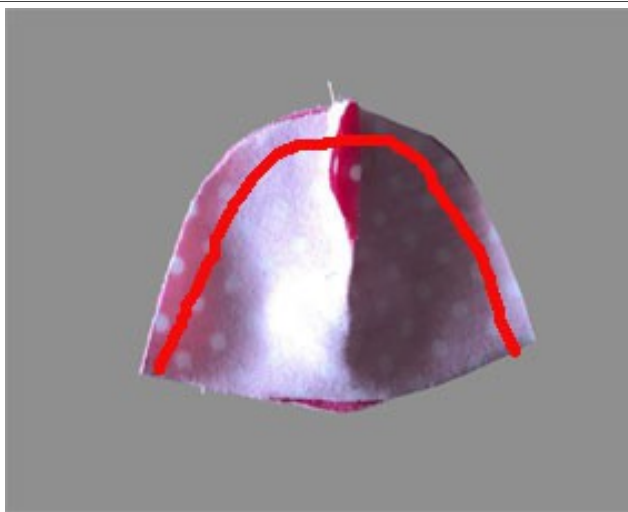
The top edge is now closed.



Sew the second beanie pattern piece together in the same way.

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Place both beanie pattern pieces right sides together, then sew them along the marking. Trim the seam allowance, then turn the beanie inside out.



Place the headscarf centered with the top edge on the top edge of the beanie. The headscarf should be positioned with the wrong side of the fabric facing the right side of the beanie. Sew the headscarf in place with a narrow seam. Make sure the headscarf covers the entire front beanie piece and extends a bit over the side seams on both the left and right.



When you fold the headscarf upwards, you will see the beanie underneath.



Place the hair with the right side of the fabric and the top edge centered along the side seam and edge of the beanie. Sew the hair in place with a narrow seam.



Sew the second hair piece to the second side seam of the beanie in the same way.



Place the waistband in the middle, right sides together, then sew it along the marking.



Turn the waistband inside out. Then fold it in half and align the edges together. The fabric should be placed with the wrong sides facing each other.



Pull the waistband over the beanie as shown in the picture, with the right sides of the fabrics facing each other. Make sure the seam of the waistband is positioned at the center of the back of the beanie. Sew both pieces together all around along the marking. Then trim the seam allowance.



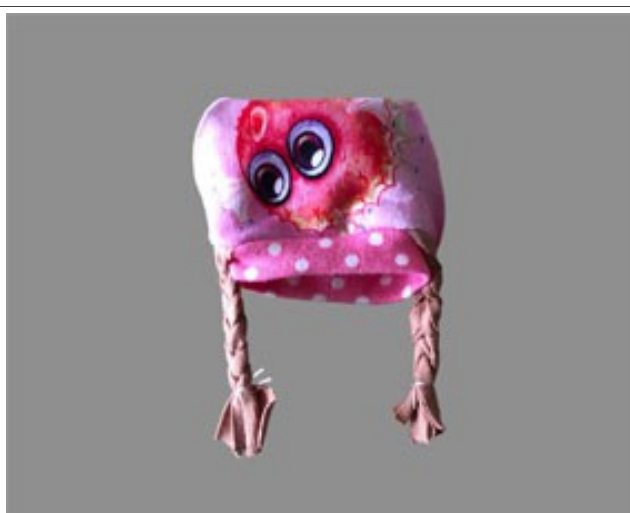
The headscarf is finished. Now the braids still need to be completed.



Cut the individual strands that you marked earlier into the fabric. You will then have three strands for the braid.



Braid the strands together. Use a thread to tie the braid at the bottom.



Create the other braid on the other side in the same way.

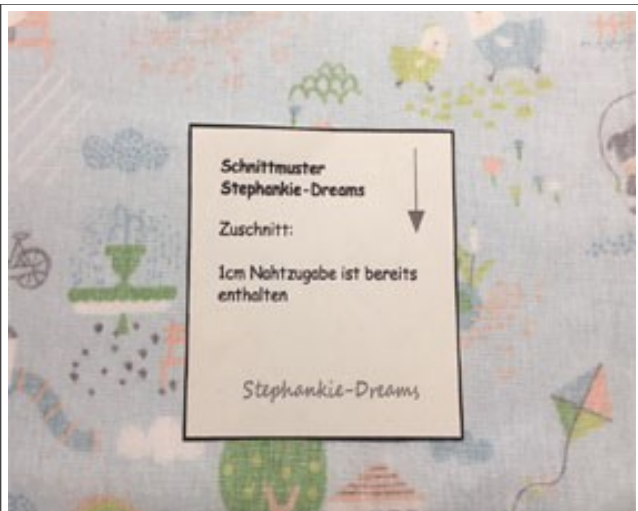


The headscarf with the braids is finished. It looks great on an egg with a girl's face.

sewing instructions headscarf with visor



First, cut out all required pattern pieces from fabric, batting, and fusible interfacing. Then, press all fabric pieces and iron fusible interfacing onto the respective pieces.



The pattern is placed with the writing facing up on the left side of the fabric. Mirror image means the writing is on the fabric side. Here too, it is placed on the left side of the fabric.

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You now have the following pattern pieces:

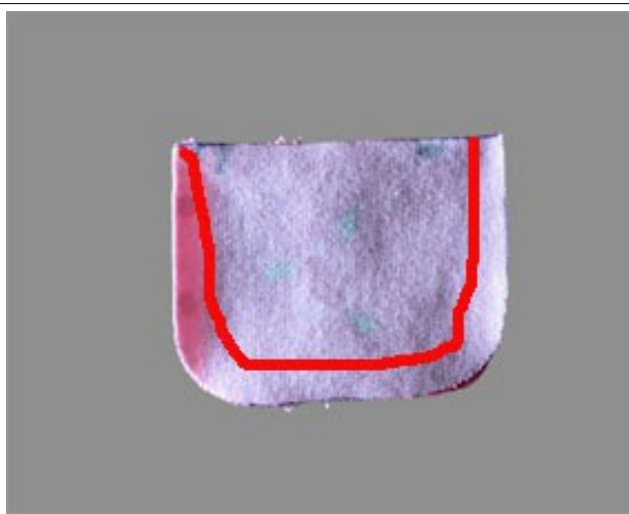


beanie 2x, 1x of which opposite
waistband 1x
headscarf 1x
visor 2x fabric, 1x of which opposite, 1x
fusible interfacing

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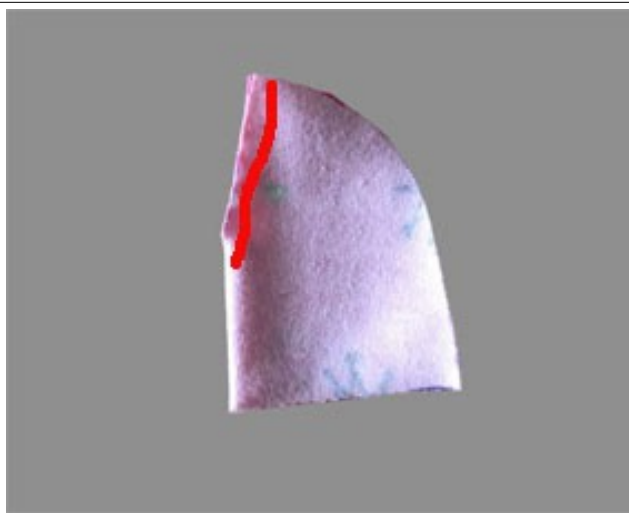
make from the headscarf with visor



Place both brim pattern pieces right sides together, then sew them along the marking.



Trim the seam allowance. Then turn the visor inside out.



Place the beanie pattern piece in the middle, right sides together. Sew the top open edge along the marking.



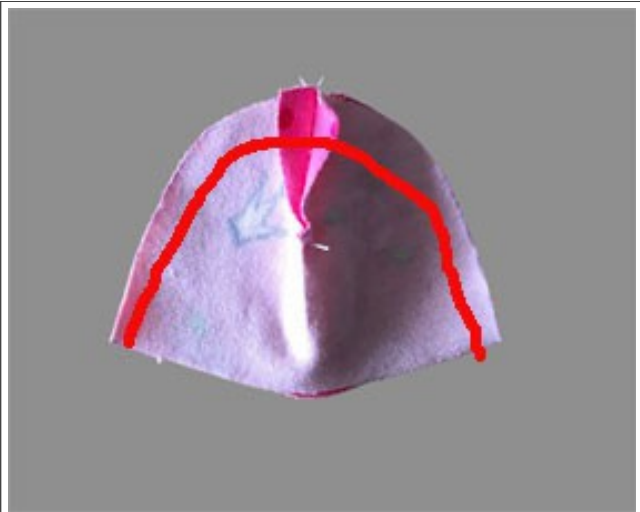
The top edge is now closed.

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Sew the second beanie pattern piece together in the same way.



Place both beanie pattern pieces right sides together, then sew them along the marking.



Trim the seam allowance, then turn the beanie inside out.



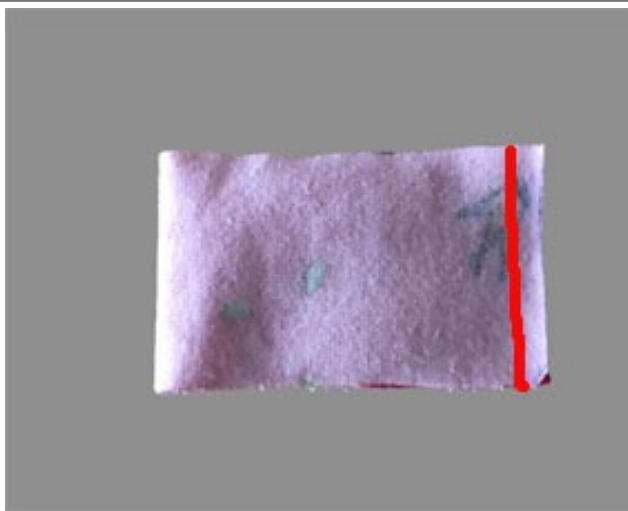
Place the headscarf centered with the top edge on the top edge of the beanie. The headscarf should be positioned with the wrong side of the fabric facing the right side of the beanie. Sew the headscarf in place with a narrow seam. Make sure the headscarf covers the entire front beanie piece and extends a bit over the side seams on both the left and right.



When you fold the headscarf upwards, you will see the beanie underneath.



Place the brim as shown in the picture, centered on the front part of the beanie. Sew the brim in place with a narrow seam.



Place the waistband in the middle, right sides together, then sew it along the marking.



Turn the waistband inside out. Then fold it in half and align the edges together. The fabric should be placed with the wrong sides facing each other.



Pull the waistband over the beanie as shown in the picture, with the right sides of the fabrics facing each other. Make sure the seam of the waistband is positioned at the center of the back of the beanie. Sew both pieces together all around along the marking. Then trim the seam allowance.



The headscarf with the brim is finished.

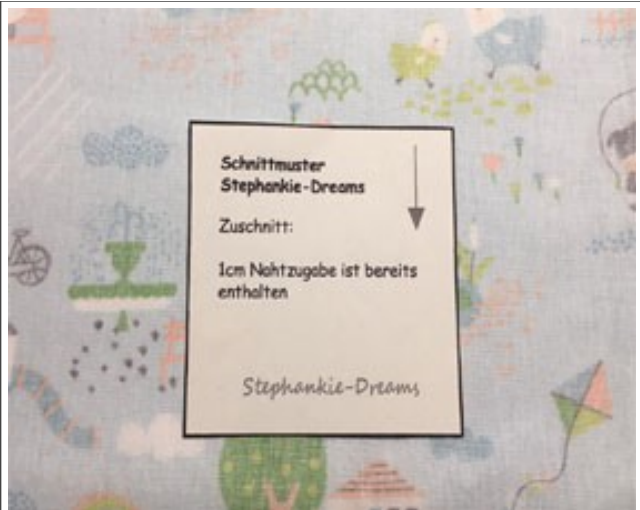


The headscarf with the brim goes well with an egg with a girl's face.

sewing instructions beanie as hair replacement



First, cut out all required pattern pieces from fabric, batting, and fusible interfacing. Then, press all fabric pieces.

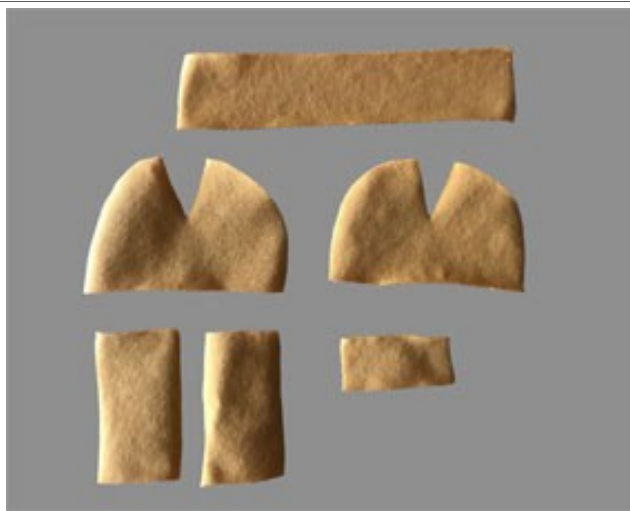


The pattern is placed with the writing facing up on the left side of the fabric. Mirror image means the writing is on the fabric side. Here too, it is placed on the left side of the fabric.

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You now have the following pattern pieces:



beanie 2x, 1x of which opposite
waistband 1x
hairs 2x
bangs 1x

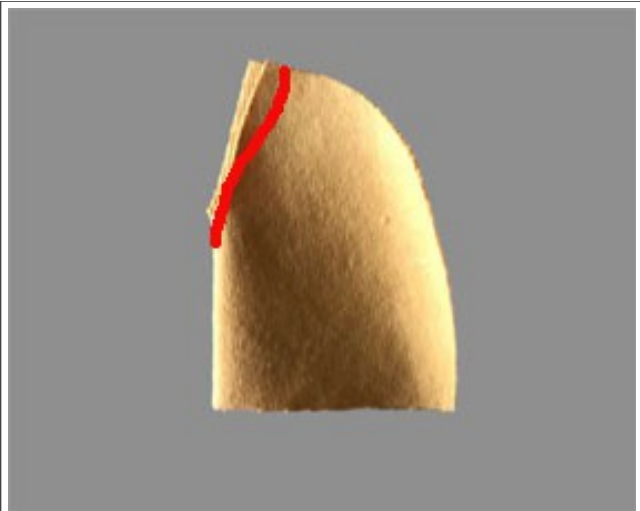
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make from the beanie as hair replacement



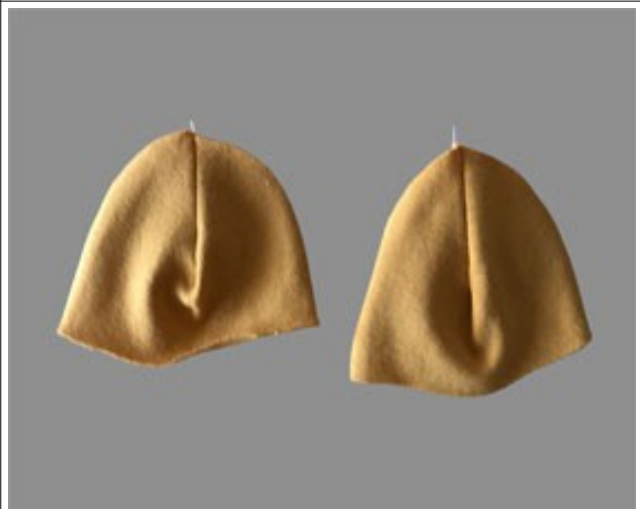
First, draw the individual hair strands on the left fabric side of the hair. To do this, measure 0,39 in from the top edge and make a marking. This is the seam allowance, where the hair will be sewn to the beanie. Then, make a marking at 0,39 in intervals along the width. These are the individual hair strands.



Place the beanie pattern piece in the middle, right sides together. Sew the top open edge along the marking.



The top edge is now closed.



Sew the second beanie pattern piece together in the same way.

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Place both beanie pattern pieces right sides together, then sew them along the marking.



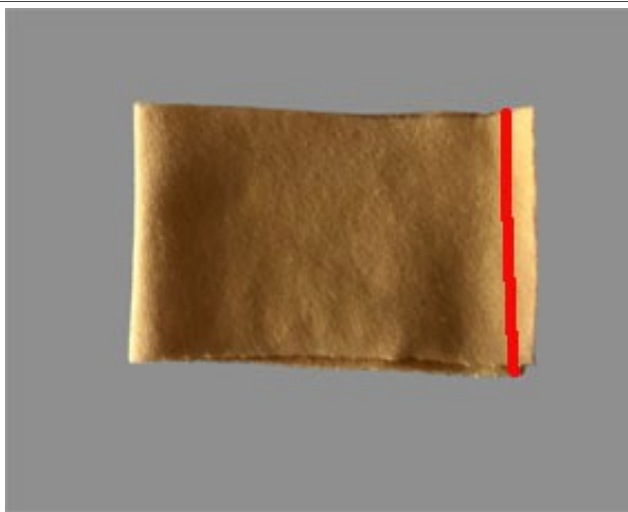
Trim the seam allowance, then turn the beanie inside out.



Place the hair with the right side of the fabric and the top edge centered along the side seam and edge of the beanie. Sew the hair in place with a narrow seam.



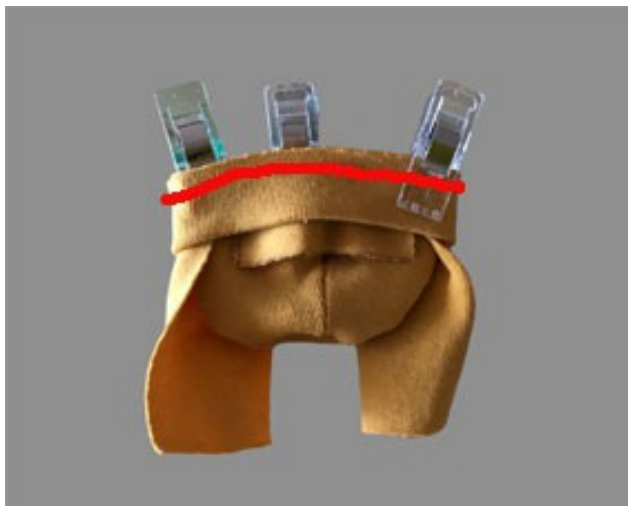
Sew the second hair piece to the second side seam of the beanie in the same way. Between the two hair pieces, the bangs are sewn in place with a narrow seam.



Place the waistband in the middle, right sides together, then sew it along the marking.






Turn the waistband inside out. Then fold it in half and align the edges together. The fabric should be placed with the wrong sides facing each other.



Pull the waistband over the beanie as shown in the picture, with the right sides of the fabrics facing each other. Make sure the seam of the waistband is positioned at the center of the back of the beanie. Sew both pieces together all around along the marking. Then trim the seam allowance.



The beanie is finished, now the braids and bangs still need to be completed.

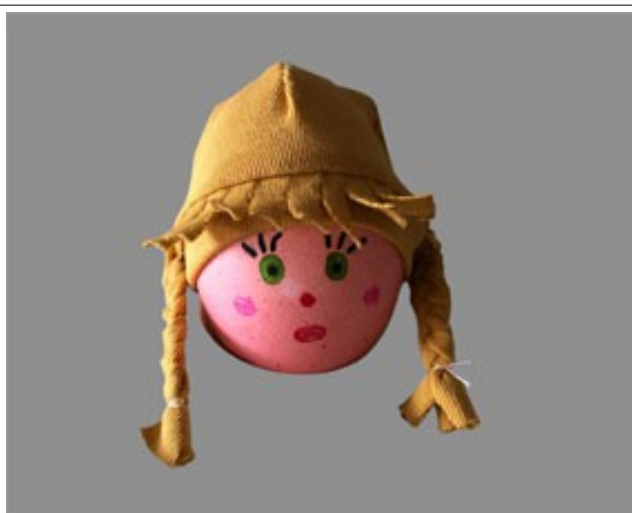
	<p>Cut the individual strands that you marked earlier into the fabric. You will then have three strands for the braid.</p>
	<p>Braid the strands together. Use a thread to tie the braid at the bottom.</p>
	<p>Create the other braid on the other side in the same way.</p>

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Finally, cut a few strands into the bangs.

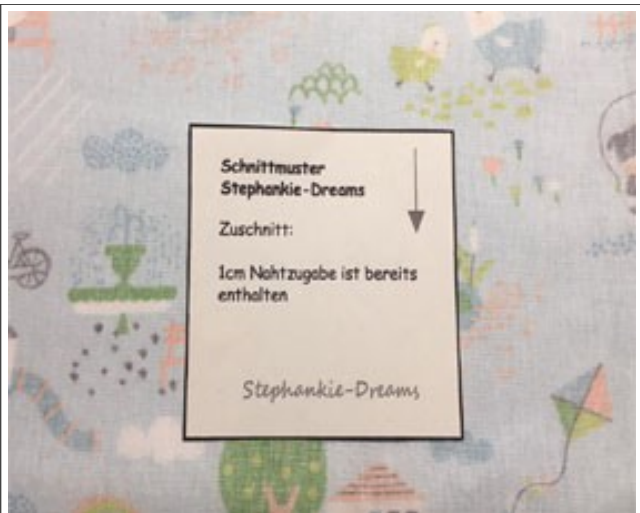


The beanie as hair replacement is finished.

sewing instructions bunny with floppy ears



First, cut out all required pattern pieces from fabric, batting, and fusible interfacing. Then, press all fabric pieces and iron fusible interfacing onto the respective pieces.

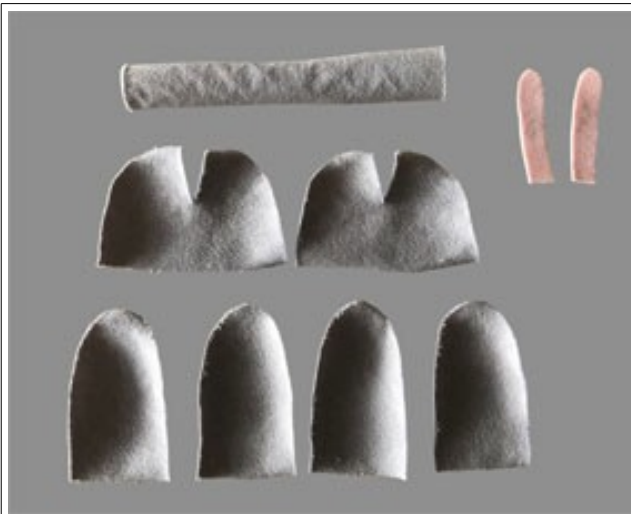


The pattern is placed with the writing facing up on the left side of the fabric. Mirror image means the writing is on the fabric side. Here too, it is placed on the left side of the fabric.

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You now have the following pattern pieces:



beanie 2x, 1x of which opposite
waistband 1x
floppy ears 4x, 2x of which opposite
floppy ears inside 2x fabric, 1x of which
opposite
2x fusible interfacing, 1x of which
opposite

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make from the bunny with floppy ears



Place the inner ears centered on two of the outer ears. Sew the inner ears in place using an appliqué stitch.



Place an outer ear with the appliquéd inner ear right sides together with a corresponding outer ear. Sew both together along the marking.



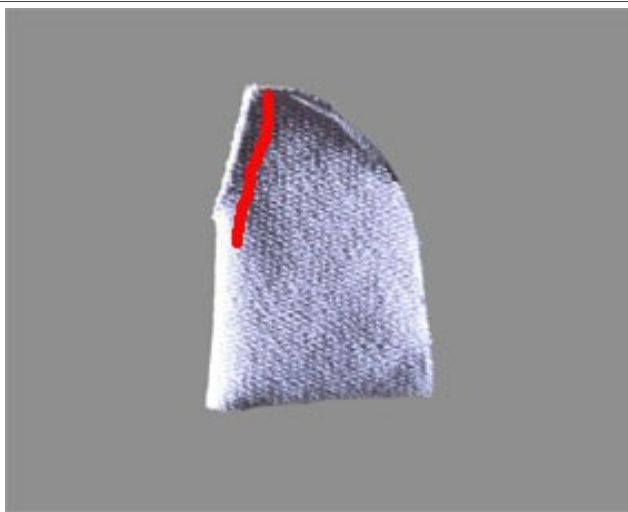
Trim the seam allowance. Turn the ear inside out.



Sew the second ear in the same way.

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Place the beanie pattern piece in the middle, right sides together. Sew the top open edge along the marking.



The top edge is now closed.



Sew the second beanie pattern piece together in the same way.



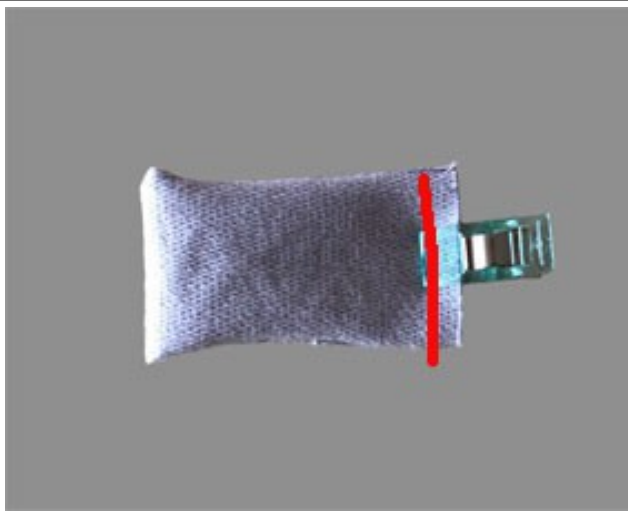
Place the ears on a beanie pattern piece, centered along the top edge. The inner ear should be facing the right side of the beanie fabric. There should be about 0,39 in of space between both ears. Sew the ears in place with a narrow seam.



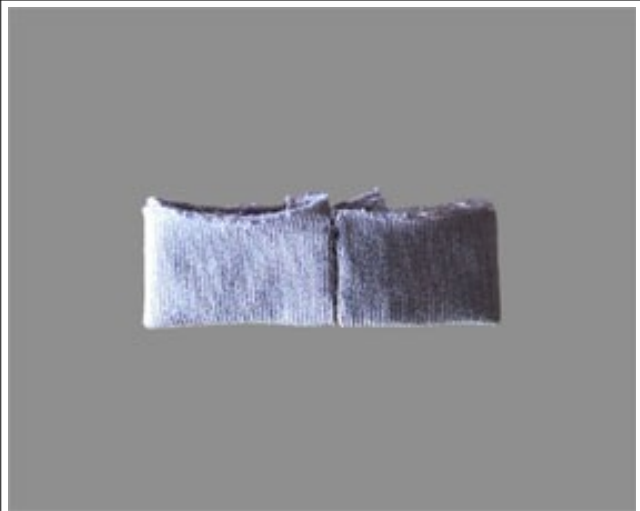
Place both beanie pattern pieces right sides together, then sew them along the marking. Make sure that the ears are placed between the two beanie pattern pieces.



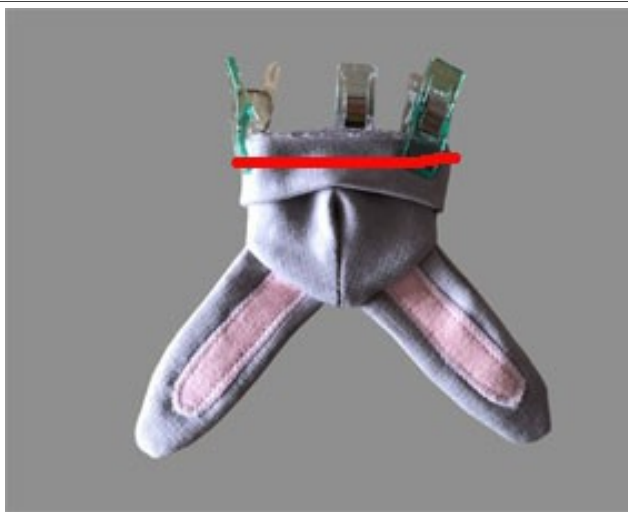
Trim the seam allowance, then turn the beanie inside out.



Place the waistband in the middle, right sides together, then sew it along the marking.



Turn the waistband inside out. Then fold it in half and align the edges together. The fabric should be placed with the wrong sides facing each other.



Pull the waistband over the beanie as shown in the picture, with the right sides of the fabrics facing each other. Make sure the seam of the waistband is positioned at the center of the back of the beanie. Sew both pieces together all around along the marking. Then trim the seam allowance.

Fold the ears down. Sew them along the edge of the ear.

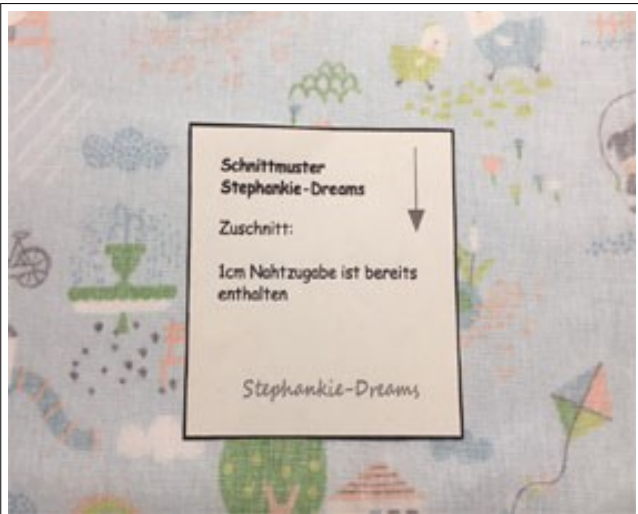

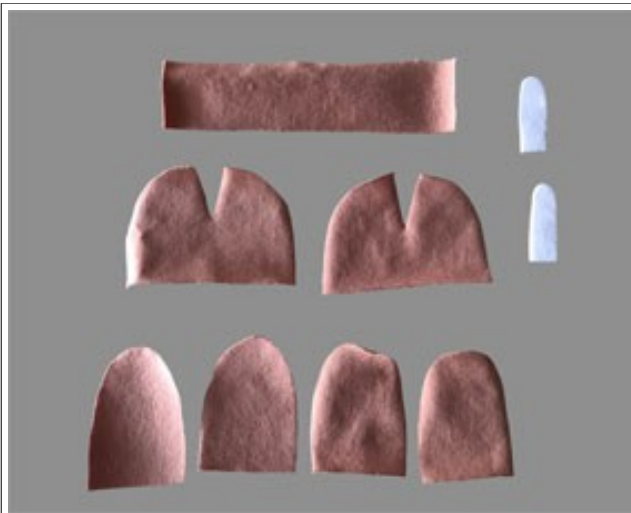

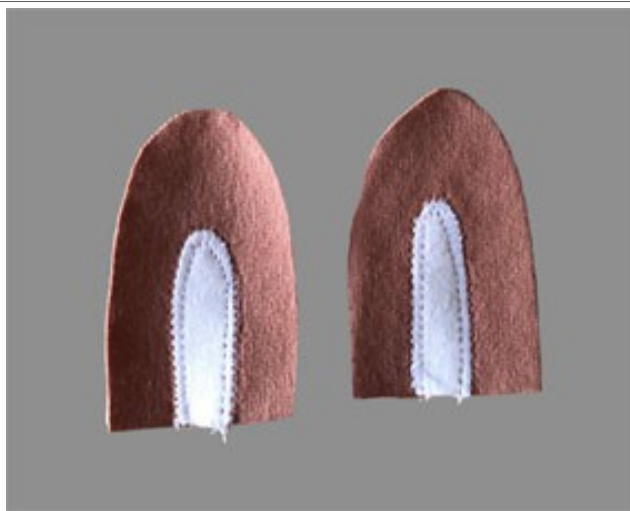

Place an outer ear with the appliquéd inner ear right sides together with a corresponding outer ear. Sew both together along the marking.



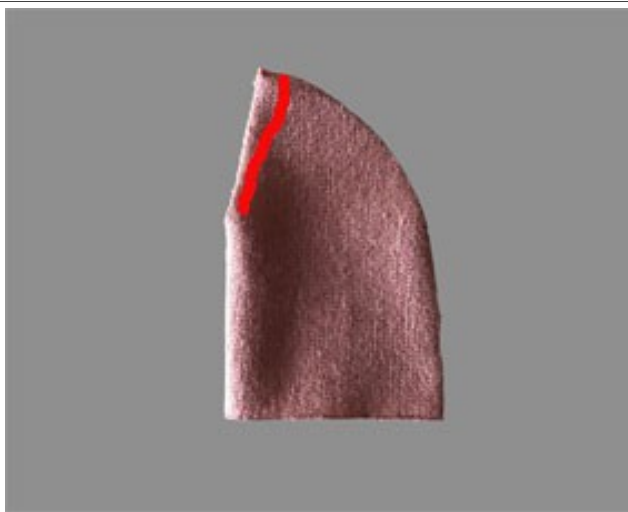
Trim the seam allowance. Turn the ear inside out.

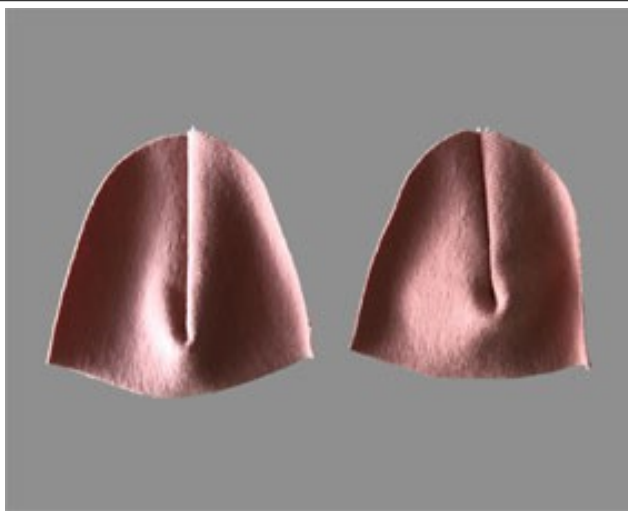

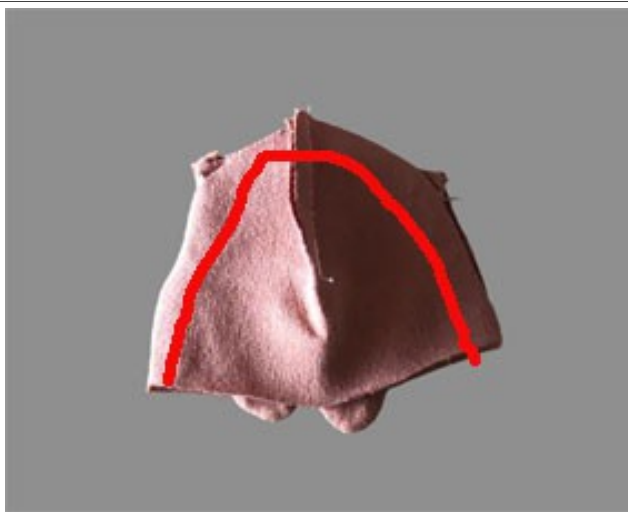

Pull the waistband over the beanie as shown in the picture, with the right sides of the fabrics facing each other. Make sure the seam of the waistband is positioned at the center of the back of the beanie. Sew both pieces together all around along the marking.

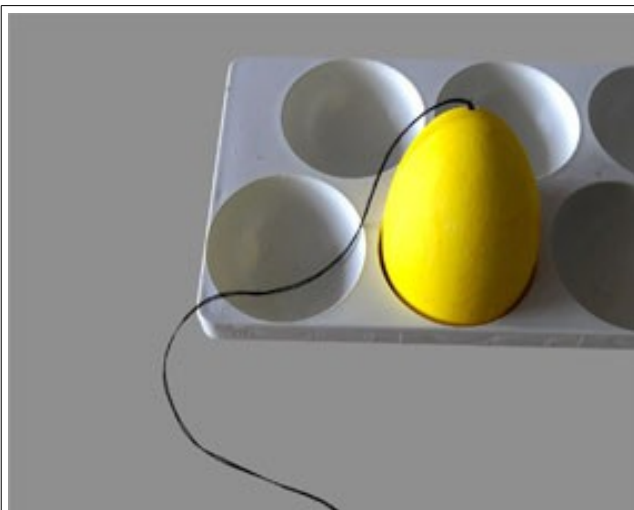

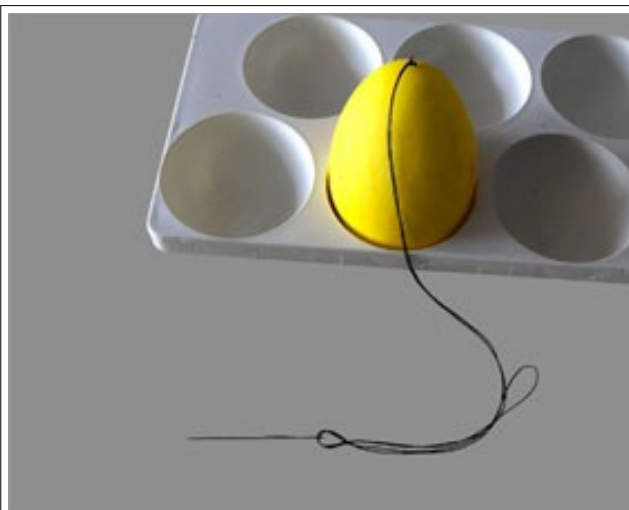

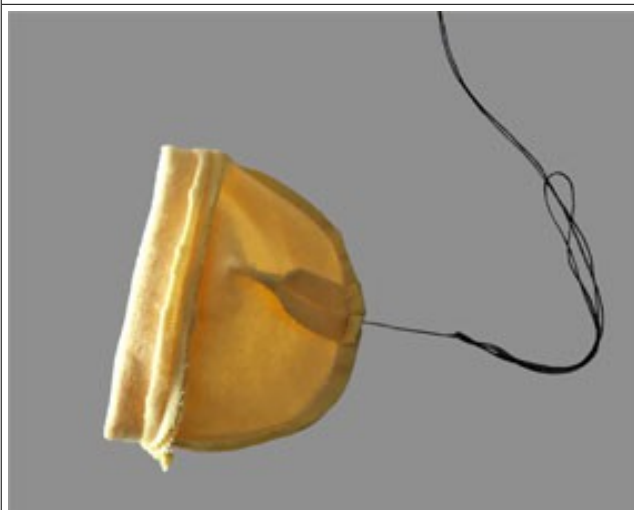
Attaching the beanie to Easter eggs for the Easter tree.



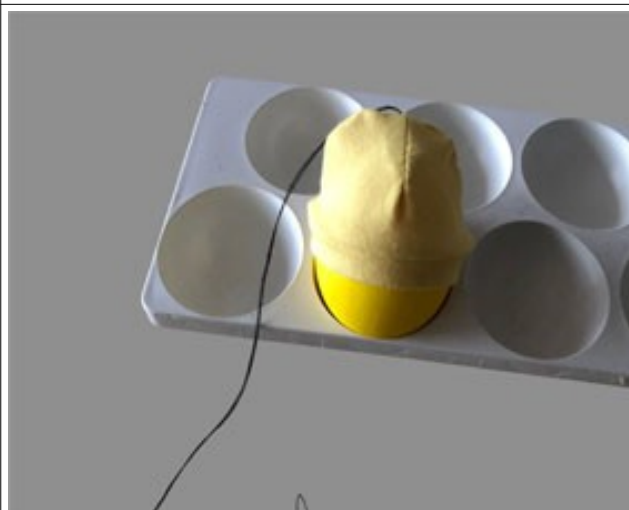
To attach the beanie to the blown-out eggs, first, a thread is attached to the egg.



The front part of the thread is threaded through a needle.



Then, insert the needle through the center of the beanie on the wrong side of the fabric.



Pull the thread through the beanie and then place it on the egg.



On the Easter tree, many different Easter eggs with the various beanies look great.
